This week

Give witness to your faith this week by living the way of Christ: do not judge others, act with humility, respond to the needs of others, pray often.

The feast of the Ascension celebrates the physical separation of Jesus from the human story, but today's gospel promises his continual presence 'to the end of time'.

After three years of living, working and praying with the disciples, Jesus commissions them to continue his work in the world. This is a difficult challenge for some disciples who, although prepared to go the appointed place, still hesitate! Despite their misgivings and fragile faith, he sends them out to all nations. Jesus has been given the authority that was once the exclusive domain of the God of Israel; Jesus has become the presence of the living God and his presence will continue with his disciples through the Holy Spirit.

RESPECT LIFE SUNDAY

Today we remember that every human life is sacred and belongs to God. This includes all those who through some kind of sickness or illness are temporarily or permanently disabled. Pope John Paul II reminded us that "Human life is always good. It is a manifestation of God in the world, a sign of his presence, a trace of his glory."

Pope Benedict reminds us that "We are not some casual and meaningless produce of evolution. Each of us is the result of a thought of God. Each of us is willed, each of us is loved, each of us is necessary."

Each of us is made in the image and likeness of God. For this reason the Church defends all human life from its very first moments, until its natural death. The Church stands beside all those whose lives are threatened through sickness or disability. All life belongs to God. Benedict He also says: "The Gospel of life and love is also the Gospel of Mercy, offered to the real and sinful people that we are, to raise them from any failing and repair any wound."

Religious freedom under new threat in Victoria

Act now to keep our freedom!

Victorians have already lost the right to free speech on religious matters because of the Racial and Religious Tolerance Act 2001 - under which Christians have been prosecuted for truthful but critical comments on Islam and for opposing witchcraft. The Victorian Department of Justice is now carrying out an "Exceptions Review" of the Equal Opportunity Act 1995 which could lead to the removal of the three important exemptions to discrimination based on religion:

Maintaining the religious exemptions in the Equal Opportunity Act 1995 is absolutely necessary to ensure the right of Victorians to exercise genuine religious freedom. The current exemptions are compatible with the Charter's (Section 14) provision on the right to "freedom of thought, conscience, religion and belief".
