NATIONAL SORRY DAY – May 26

Australians will commemorate the history of the removal of Indigenous Australians which resulted in the Stolen Generation on May 26. This year marks 11 years since the release of the Bringing them Home report. What can you do? Show your support by wearing a native hibiscus flower on May 26. From the website: "We seek your participation to make the 11th anniversary of the 'Bringing Them Home' report a key factor in the recognition of Australia's Stolen Generations. You can remind the current administration about this issue and you can show your solidarity for genuine remembrance and healing by wearing a native hibiscus flower on May 26, 2008. Most people have no idea what the Commemorative Flower signifies and of the continuing work that needs to be done for victims of the Stolen Generations right across Australia. The 'silk' flower has been created as a national emblem of the Stolen Generations. This was initially proposed by members of the Kimberley Stolen Generation Aboriginal Corporation, and later endorsed by the National Sorry Day Committee. It is wholeheartedly supported by the Stolen Generations Alliance. This flower was adopted because it is found widely across Australia and it is a survivor. Its colour denotes compassion and spiritual healing.

My corner

This semester, I have been studying a course at YTU called "Catholic Social Teaching and Indigenous Peoples". It fitted in beautifully with my planned pilgrimage to Lake Mungo and the Flinders Ranges, and the lecturer has been very accommodating and helpful in allowing me to use parts of the pilgrimage towards assessment. As a consequence of all this study, my thoughts have been very much involved with aboriginal affairs. This week, National Reconciliation Week, is a very exciting one for our aboriginal communities. With the Apology in February, they have had their spirits lifted hugely, and from what I have seen and heard, are incredibly optimistic that reconciliation will continue at all levels—national, local, personal. There hasn't been such hope for our indigenous people since Pope John Paul's address to them in 1986, where he challenged the Church (and the whole nation) to joyfully receive the Aboriginal people, and he challenged them to make their own unique contribution to the church in Australia. In Box Hill, we rarely see any aboriginal people, and can easily think that their problems and issues are something separate from our lives. As Christians, and as members of the Body of Christ, we know that we are called to love and care for one another. I hope that we will all join together this week to pray for true reconciliation and acceptance for all Australian aboriginal people.
