Could you have watched the Paralympics without being inspired and challenged—without a tear, or without immense admiration for the athletes? Could you have failed to be moved by the amazing efforts they made, their dedication and commitment, their energy and skills?

There was an almost tangible generosity of spirit displayed between the athletes, which in no way diminished the fact that they all wanted to win. And those who didn't achieve all they had planned were already saying "Well, in London I'll get there."

I felt exhausted just watching some of the events, and can't imagine what strengths they had to draw on to achieve their goals. Maybe adversity has taught them greater courage.

All this has me thinking about the report on page 21 of Wednesday's Herald Sun that said less than 200 people turned up to their welcome home ceremony in Sydney. If the Hawks can be offered the keys of the city, (of Hawthorn), what sort of honours should have been showered on our athletes? Where were the media?

I didn't see any reports or hear anything else about this event. I'm wondering what it says about us—that we don't give due honour to people who are so deserving? Maybe we don't know how to express our admiration, or maybe we think the Paralympics were not too important.

I'd like to think we have been humbled and inspired by these fine athletes.
